### Collaborations & Partnerships

St. Judes' new vertical, St. Judes for Life (Founded in Memory of Mrs. Rani Vicaji) has been set up with the intention to support our survivors, thereby fulfilling the motto 'Once a St. Judes child, always a St. Judes child'.

Cancer survivors require a strong support system to help them become self-reliant and independent and make up for lost time and opportunities. To help them with the same St. Judes for Life (Founded in Memory of Mrs. Rani Vicaji) has collaborated with experienced partners and mentors. Due to the geographic distance and diversity of our survivors, the projects are conducted virtually through partners and experts in the areas of education, health, livelihood and life skills. Some of our partners include:







- Samiksha Foundation, Indian Cancer Society and Tata Memorial Hospital who support with academic assistance.
- In the field of livelihood, we are associating with ICICI Foundation, Pratham Institute and Yuva Parivartan.
- Meraki is enabling female survivors to learn a programming language and
- Umeedein, our partner in Odisha, has undertaken family and school visits, conducted counselling sessions and provided referral services for our survivors in the state
- Lumiere Business Solutions and DataOgram provide research and data
- Mrs. Payal Parikh, one of our long time well-wishers, donated money for welcome kits for our new enrollees.

Currently, around 421 children have enrolled with St. Judes for Life (Founded in Memory of Mrs. Rani Vicaji), out of which 80 have benefited from a combination of facilities provided by the programme. St. Judes for Life (Founded in Memory of Mrs. Rani Vicaji) is projected to cater to over 2000 survivors by 2025.
