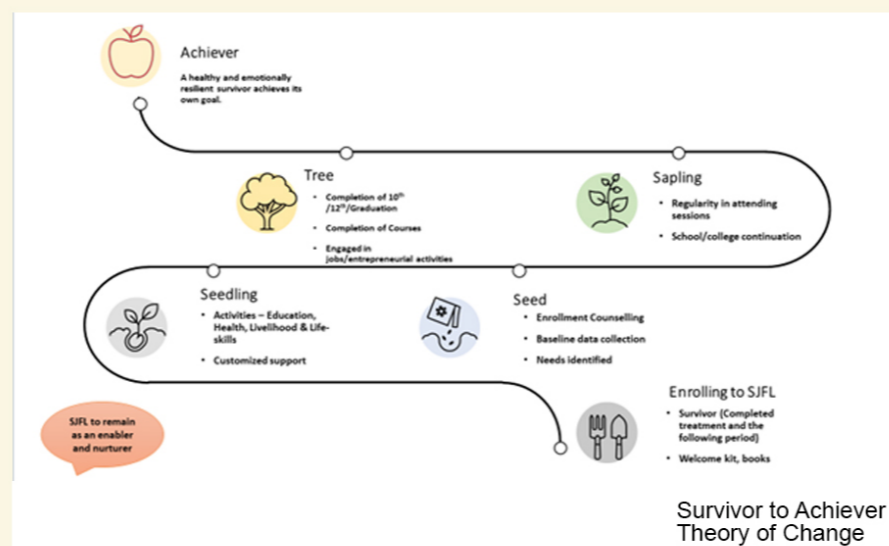
Events like these help parents take their minds off the stress of their child's treatment and helps them to relax and unwind.



St. Jude's For Life - Theory of Change

Our latest vertical, **St. Jude's for Life** (Founded in the Memory of Mrs. Rani Vicaji), provides support to St. Jude's survivors to realise their potential and fulfil their aspirations. Since most of the beneficiaries come from underprivileged families, our survivors require a robust support system to help them become self-reliant and independent. The vertical focuses on four primary areas: **Education, Health, Livelihood** and Life skills and uses the **Theory of Change** to illustrate a survivor's journey.

Given the geographical spread, the program is digitally and remotely implemented. Apart from offering personalised individual support, the vertical conducts monthly virtual group calls on pre-decided themes based on the four focus areas.



Impact so far

- We teamed up with Star Health and Allied Insurance to provide insurance coverage to **323** survivors.
- Over **300** beneficiaries have availed of the counselling service.
- 113** survivors have undergone individual Career Counseling sessions.
- Two of our survivors are engaged in a **paid Internship with St. Jude's for Life** (Founded in the Memory of Mrs. Rani Vicaji).
- With **Barclay's** support, **182** phones have been dispatched to date for beneficiaries.
- We have also secured funding for **20 laptops** which will be distributed to eligible and deserving candidates.

Upcoming projects

- A **virtual Career Mela** is being planned for the end of April 2022.
- Complete enrolment of the **new batch of over 350 eligible survivors** from Delhi, Jaipur, Kolkata and Hyderabad centres.
- Collaborations with **JPMorgan Chase** and **Morgan Stanley** for technological support.
- Identifying **local and central partners** for effective execution of the services.
