



St. Judes Opens Another Centre In Varanasi 🧣

We are happy to share that we recently opened another centre in Varanasi. The new facility is located in Sikraul and has 16 units - 15 regular and one isolation unit. Opened in collaboration with Tata Memorial Centre and Nagar Nigam, it will help us provide free accommodation and holistic care to 16 families who come for cancer treatment at The Homi Bhabha Cancer Hospital.

This centre is our second centre in the city. The first one, launched in partnership with HBCH in 2020, is also a 16-unit centre located within the Mahamana Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya Cancer Centre (MPMMCC) and supports 23 new patients and 37 returnee patients in 2020-21.

With the opening of the new centre, St. Judes now has 38 Centres supporting over 480 families in Mumbai, Kolkata, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Vellore, Guwahati, Chennai, Delhi, and Varanasi.



Partnerships & Collaborations

Employees at Barclays India held an internal fundraiser among their teams to support various Indian NGOs. One of the teams got together to raise funds for St. Judes. During the week-long competition, team managers spoke to their colleagues about St. Judes, our cause, and children, to familiarise them with the organisation. The money raised by the team was matched by Barclays India who donated an addition of the same amount to us.

A healthy and nourishing diet is one of our most important offerings to the children and parents who stay with us. They have been providing families with nutritious ration in our centres in Mumbai, Chennai, Jaipur and Hyderabad. Their support has been vital in providing a balanced diet to our children, thus giving them a better chance to beat cancer.



Pravinkumar N was diagnosed with blood cancer last year and came to Sir John Hanson Centre in Chennai in December 2021. They belong to the Thoothukudi district of Tamil Nadu. His father, Nandarajan Athiyappan, works in a private firm, and his mother used to work in a candle-making factory, but she left the job after her child was diagnosed with cancer.



Pravinkumar is undergoing treatment at the Institute of Child Health. Expenses there are very high, and they can not afford them. The hospital suggested they contact St. Judes for help. The family was delighted when they got a place to stay in our centres and has adjusted well to it. Currently, Pravinkumar is undergoing chemotherapy. We wish him a speedy recovery.

According to his mother, Muneeswari N, "We are so happy in St. Judes. They look after all our needs and support us in every way possible. They also provide us with regular nutrition packs to help us follow a healthy diet, ensuring our son can recover well. Overall, we love this place."
